# **Texas Health Impact Cohort**

Selected by ViiV Healthcare as one of many AMP Grant Program Leads, TPCF is a proud member of a nationwide cohort working to disrupt disparities and prioritize the needs of people living with, and impacted by, HIV across the US. ViiV's three-year AMP Grant incubators serve as resource hubs and think tanks for leaders, networks and projects across HIV, health, housing and wellness. Resources fund and support individuals and organizations leading grassroots HIV outreach with micro-grants, mentorship and other network supports.



#### Overview

TPCF launches our 2<sup>nd</sup> multi-year Texas Health Impact Cohort program. Funding is designed for grassroot organizations currently leading work, or seeking to develop innovative work, focused on three key areas:

- 1) Networking
- 2) Linkage and Engagement to Care
- 3) Advocacy for People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWH), those vulnerable to HIV, and their families, particularly focusing on Black and Latinx transgender individuals and Black and Latinx MSM.



## **Areas of Focus (Short-term)**

- Reduce isolation through stronger networks of PLWHA and those who serve/support them,
- Strengthen systems of referrals and connections that help close service/care gaps,
- Reduce challenges to access affirming, quality medical and supportive services for underserved communities,



## **Areas of Focus (Short-term)**

- Increase the number of people linked, re-linked, and engaged in care in hardest to reach areas,
- Advance awareness of HIV/AIDS care among consumers, communities, caregivers and providers,
- Advance feelings of empathy on how the epidemic affects PLWHA and their communities



## **Areas of Focus (Long-term)**

- Reducing stigma
- Elevating voices and raising visibility of PLWHA
- Increasing trust in HIV care
- Increasing linkage and engagement in care



# Reach (Groups)

- Personal support networks (family, friends, partner),
- Service providers (non-medical, HIV or non-HIV)



# Reach (Demographics)

# Who is eligible to apply?

- TPCF seeks proposals for innovative work in Texas supporting BIPOC and LGBTQ+ communities historically excluded by society from equitable opportunities.
- Organization must be based in Texas and proposed efforts must uniquely serve Texas's Black, Latinx and Indigenous LGBTQ+ communities.
- ➤ Should help sustain and grow capacity and forward movement to empower People Living With HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) and LGBTQ+ people living at the intersection of marginalized identities, particularly Black and Latinx individuals, and other communities of color, displaced people and people living with disabilities.



# Who is eligible to apply?

- Must be a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization or fiscally sponsored by a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.
- For Groups do not need 501(c)(3) tax exempt status to apply. Those lacking 501(c)(3) status can apply as being fiscally sponsored under the auspices of an established 501(c)(3).
- ➤ Very strong preference will be given to organizations with expenses of less than \$1 million.
- Regardless of their structure or age, the applicant's proposal should be able to demonstrate their alignment with the values of TPCF and potential for advancing its vision.



# Who is eligible to apply?

- Preference is given to projects and programs that respond to a distinct unmet need in the target communities and employ short-term to long-term solutions.
- Applicants are required to be a part of a learning community and will be asked to participate with other community leaders, including convenings, leadership and organizational development training, and peer learning opportunities.



#### **Funding Available**

Grants for this annual cycle can be up to \$12,500 with the opportunity to be renewed for three (3) years total.



## **Learning Community**

All funded organizations will participate in a cohort with other grantees for capacity building and shared learning throughout the grant cycle which will include virtual convenings. TPCF will work with grantees to determine the most appropriate technical assistance and training support throughout the grant cycle.



## Reporting Requirements

Annual progress report on work done with funds at the end of each grant cycle by submitting a progress report via the report form received from TPCF's Program Director. A final written grant narrative is due upon completion of the grant cycle to the Program Director.

#### Progress and final reports must include:

- > a clear evaluation of results and goals met from proposal;
- a consistent method of gathering feedback from those who are affected by the work, results, and how the applicant is responding to what they learned.



#### What we won't fund...

- Initiatives and projects outside of Texas
- For charity, direct cash assistance, or individual scholarships
- 501(c)4 direct lobbying activities
- Efforts led by other philanthropic grantmaking institutions or for the purpose of regranting
- Sponsorships for conferences, fundraisers, or other annual or one-time events... exceptions may be made for service / educational events, such as strategic conferences and convenings however must demonstrate how it would advance a strong long-term systemic impact on target communities in a way that lives beyond that event
